This year was another great year for the Friends and our efforts to support our parks. We started the year supporting Frozenfest's Night at the Rink with fire pits to keep us warm, helping with serving hot chocolate, and setup/tear down.

In early spring, the Friends organized the annual Earth Park Clean Up. This year saw a milestone achieved where with over 200 volunteers we were able to send people to every park in the City to prepare the parks for the new season. All this was done in a surprise spring snow. Thanks to all volunteers and we look for to this coming year's Earth Day on April 22nd.



May saw the start of the planting season and the Friends stepped in to action to add four new pollinator gardens to the City park system. Three were installed around new park signs in Orfan Park, Wyndham Hills Park, and Grandview Park. We also installed a pollinator garden in Sheehan Park in memory of Sue Larson who was an advocate for the environment and supporter of our parks.

We began our efforts to help the City remove invasive species from the parks' natural areas. The Friends organized volunteers to clear buckthorn and honeysuckle from Shonas Highlands Park starting in the spring and continuing into the late fall months. Their efforts cleared invasive brush from the understory to promote a healthier environment. Those efforts were completed and the Friends are moving to Sheehan to support the same efforts.



Summer saw the Friends participating in various events in the parks and to raising funds and awareness for the organization. From a Beer Garden in Orfan Park, to the Sun Prairie Farmers Market, to the Multi-Cultural Fair, the Friends were out and about to raise awareness of our activities and to raise funds to support our efforts.

We closed out the year with another community playground build. Volunteers constructed a new playground in Royal Oaks Park with the help of the contractor and City staff. In one day, the volunteers did what was planned to be two days of work—building the ADA accessible playground and spreading over 120 cubic yards of mulch.

Anticipating



Our parks will be improved and maintained by both City staff and volunteers. The Parks Friends will continue to organize the annual Earth Day Park Clean Up on April 20, 2024, plant and/or improve Pollinator Gardens in the City's parks in May, remove invasive species from the natural areas of our parks throughout the year, help construct a playground in fall, support special programs in winter and summer, and participate in other volunteer activities.



Additionally, the Parks Friends advocates for the Parks, Recreation and Forestry in the City's budgeting process. This year the Capital Improvement Program has \$1,365,000 worth of projects scheduled in addition to the Wetmore Shelter replacement, which is underway. These projects include Sunset Park - Token Creek Access, Westwynde Park Rehabilitation, Creekview Crossing Development Park Design & Construction, FAC Bathhouse Renovation, Town Hall Crossing Park Development, Basketball Court Rehabilitation, and the Wetmore Park Pedestrian Bridge Replacement.

The Parks Friends are also raising funds and assisting in the design of a disc golf course in the City, to provide this exciting recreation opportunity here in Sun Prairie.
